Major Class Revision, **Smaller Fields Slated** For Woman Golfers

Approximately 110 women golfers will be shut out of tournament golf next season—simply because the District's private courses with their jam-packed membership lists cannot spare the golfing gals enough time for their competitive activities.

Last year the Women's District Golf Association listed 403 active members with handicap cards—a total that will be cut to less than 300 next season in the opinion of Mrs. W. F. Patterson, who yesterday was elected to a second term as president of the association.

as president of the association.

Instead of catering to women golfers with handicaps of scratch through 36, the association probably will reduce the maximum handicap limit for tournaments to 26 next year. Based on last year's lists, Class A will be from one through 14 handicaps with 111 members; Class B, 15 through 20 with 100 members, and Class C, 21 through 26 with 85 members.

In addition to the District championship, the WDGA now has six major cup tournaments for both the A and B class players. But, to take care of the new C class, sponsors may be asked to rearrange their cups so that each class. their cups so that each class will have four medal-play tournaments.

In the past year the Class A and B fields became too bulky and it has become increasingly difficult to obtain courses for the large fields. Under the new plan the maximum tournament entry list probably would not exceed 75.

But Mrs. Patterson does not plan to leave the 27 to 36 handicapped golfers without an incentive. Heretofore the association has allotted funds for a junior golf program that never has been successful.

Those funds would be earmarked for special events for the beginner class linkswomen.

Next season the tournament fields will be bigger than ever be-cause Argyle and Bethesda Country Club both became members of the association and members of those clubs will swell the entry lists.

Instead of discouraging the high-Instead of discouraging the high-handicapped players, Mrs. Patter-son is of the opinion that the new system, which the Executive Com-mittee is expected to approve, will give the 27-36 handicap players added incentive to reduce their handicaps to where they will be-come eligible for the major tourna-ments.






