Mrs. George Ficken, who upset the dope by winning the District Women's championship at Prince Georges last year, will defend her title at Bethesda June 14-18 in the highlight of a 24-event Women's District Golf Association schedule.

The WDGA season opens with the Keefer Cup tournament at Chevy Chase May 5-6 with Mrs. William Weitzen of Indian Spring the defending champion, and concludes with the President's Plate at Army Navy Oct. 12.

Argyle Women Win With Ease

Argyle, armed to the teeth and campaigning for an unprecedented eighth Women's District Golf Association team title, got off to a fast start yesterday, defeating newcomer Brooke Manor in an opening-round match, 9-0.

Army Navy, the defending champion, drew a first-round bye. The Virginia service club team dethroned Argyle in last year's title chase in the final match of the round-robin series.

In the other matches yesterday, Chevy Chase defeated Belle Haven, 6½ to 2½ and the Country Club of Fairfax defeated Indian Spring, 6½ to 2½.

Argyle won the 1954, 1955 and 1956 titles before Chevy Chase stepped in to take the 1957 and 1958 championships. Argyle won again in 1959 and then, after losing to Army Navy in 1960, came back to take the 1961, 1962 and 1963 events. Results:

Indian Spring Women Pull Upset of Argyle

In an upset so stunning that even the perpetrators could hardly believe it, Indian Spring yesterday defeated Argyle in the second round of the Women's District Golf Association team championship, 7-2.

Argyle had opened the round-robin event with a clean sweep of all nine points last week and appeared well on the road to an eighth title.

So confident was Argyle that it didn't even bother to bring along its full strength for yesterday's second round at the Country Club of Fairfax.

Chevy Chase Leads

The bit of overconfidence dropped back Argyle, which won the 1954, 1955, 1956, 1959, 1961, 1962 and 1963 titles, into second place, two points behind new leader Chevy Chase.

Army Navy, the defending champion, made its first start after an opening-round bye with a 6½-2½ victory over Belle Haven. Chevy Chase won by the same score from Brooke Manor and the Country Club of Fairfax, as the

host team, drew a second-round bye.

Indian Spring played the role of spoiler for the second time this week, upsetting Chevy Chase Club in the third round of the Women's District Golf Association team championship yesterday at Argyle, 7-2.

The surprising Indian Spring team took over the lead in the round-robin event with a total of 16½ points for three matches.

Army Navy, the defending champion, rolled to an impressive 8½-½ victory over Brooke Manor and is tied with Chevy Chase for second with 15 points. The service club team has played only two matches, having drawn a bye in last week's opening round.

The Country Club of Fairfax defeated Belle Haven, 6-3,

and advanced to fourth place with a 12½ point total for two matches. Argyle, beaten earlier in the week by the upstart Indian Spring team, drew a bye today, but still has an outside chance with 11 points in two matches.

Chevy Chase took over the league lead last Tuesday and appeared one of Army Navy's chief contenders until yesterday's stunning defeat. Chevy Chase won the title in 1957 and 1958.

Indian Spring Country Club continued its surprisingly strong bid for its first Women's District Golf Association team title yesterday at Belle Haven, defeating Brooke Manor in a fourth round match, 6½-2½.

Army Navy, defending titlist, turned back Chevy Chase, 6-3, and is runnerup to Indian Spring in the current standings.

Indian Spring, which has played one more match than Army Navy, has a 23-point total for four matches while the service club team has 21. Argyle, seeking an eighth

championship, kept within reach of the leaders by trouncing the Country Club of Fairfax, 7-2. Argyle now has 18 points and is tied for third with Chevy Chase.

One of Those Days

It just wasn't the day for the Country Club of Fairfax.

To start with, the Virginia team lost the services of its strongest player, Mrs. D. K. Holman, because of an ear infection. Then Mrs. Bruce Bollerman, former Fairfax club champion, showed up without her putter and had to play with a borrowed one.

The Virginia service club team shattered Indian Spring's hopes of winning its first title by toppling the surprising Layhill, Md., club, 5½-3½.

Army Navy has two matches remaining in the round-robin event while Indian Spring has only one. Indian Spring's only hope of grabbing the title is a couple of giant-sized assists from Argyle and the Country Club of Fairfax, Army Navy's two remaining opponents.

Argyle Now Third

Argyle, a seven-time winner, kept its title hopes alive by defeating Belle Haven, 5½-3½. Argyle is now in third place, three points behind the leaders.

The Country Club of Fairfax turned back Brooke Manor, 6½-2½. The Fairfax team now has 21 points and could possibly take it all with two big victories in the final two matches against Chevy Chase and Army Navy.

The dominance in team events that once belonged to Argyle has passed to Army Navy, following its victory in the Women's District Golf Association team match series yesterday.

This gave Army Navy 33½ points and forced a playoff for second place between Indian Spring and Argyle. Indian Spring won on the first hole on a pair of par putts.

Roland Bryant of Fairfax set the tone of the critical match with Army Navy when they shut out Mrs. William Barrow and Maj. Lucille Busch, 3-0.

Fairfax Keeps Coming

Moments later Mrs. Walter Goodrich and Mrs. H. N. McClary came in with two points from Mrs. D. L. Daub and Mrs. R. M. Brewer and it was beginning to look serious for the defending champions, who needed at least one more point to edge Indian Spring and Argyle, already finished.

Mrs. Mason Defeats Mrs. Canney In Maryland State Women's Golf

"I finally did it," Mrs. Robert Mason muttered after her last putt had fallen into the cup on the 17th green yesterday at Argyle Country Club to give the pretty medalist her first women's Maryland state amateur golf title.

It was sweet revenge for the 26-year-old University of Maryland graduate when she defeated Mrs. Richard Canney of Chantilly National Golf Club, 2 and 1, in the championship final.

In 1962, Mrs. Canney, then 17-year-old Mary Alice Sawyer, defeated Mrs. Mason, nee Jane Schiller, in the final, 1-up.

Mrs. Mason had been the medalist in the championship in 1959, 1962 and again this year. But the wife of a Pocomoke City, Md., dentist had never been able to win the title.

Mrs. Canney outdrove her smaller opponent, sometimes by as much as 75 yards, but the new champion made up for her lack of distance with a far better game around the greens. Mrs. Mason three-putted twice in the 17 holes but, it was her putter that won the title for her.

Only four holes were won in the 17 holes. Each player won a hole on the front nine and Mrs. Mason won the 14th hole to regain the lead and

won the 17th to close out the match.

Mrs. Canney, trying to reach the green on the par five second hole with her second shot, topped the ball and sent it skimming into a ditch. Mrs. Mason took advantage of the miscue by taking the hole with a par.

Mrs. Canney, wife of the golf professional at Chantilly, missed a three-foot putt for a birdie at five but then squared the match at nine when Mrs. Mason three-putted.

Mrs. Canney had a chance to take the lead at the par three 13th but took three to get down from the fringe. On the next hole, Mrs. Mason sank one of the most important putts of the match, a curling 15-footer for a birdie that put her back in front, this time to stay.

Mrs. Canney had a chance to win both the 15th and 16th holes. The 20-year-old mother of a 10-month-old daughter missed a six-foot birdie putt at 15 and took three from the front edge of the green at 16,

missing her putt for a par from only 24 inches.

At the 17th, Mrs. Mason put her tee shot on the green and Mrs. Canney's ball landed on the putting surface but bounced to the back fringe. Mrs. Canney took four to get down and Mrs. Mason two-putted to take the title.

In the championship consolation, Mrs. Walter Goodrich of the Country Club of Fairfax defeated Mrs. I. W. Elliott of Army Navy, 1-up.

Mrs. D. K. Holman, who lost to Mrs. George Ficken in the semifinals last year, had hoped to avoid a rematch this time until at least the finals in the Women's District golf championship at Bethesda.

She drew Kathryn Diggs of Manor as opening opponent in the round of 16, and Miss McKeever, whom she defeated in the extra-hole final last year, also is in her bracket.

Mrs. Holman, now the champion at Country Club of Fairfax, faced Dr. Ruth Ann Peterson of Belle Haven, last year's medalist at Prince Georges, in match play today.

In today's second round, Mrs. Ficken plays Mrs. Roland Bryant, Country Club of Fairfax. Mrs. Bryant played the best golf of the day in disposing of Mrs. I. W. Elliott, Army Navy, 6 and 5.

Mrs. Bryant was 37 for the front nine and enjoyed a five-up lead. She was two-over for the four holes she played on the back nine.
