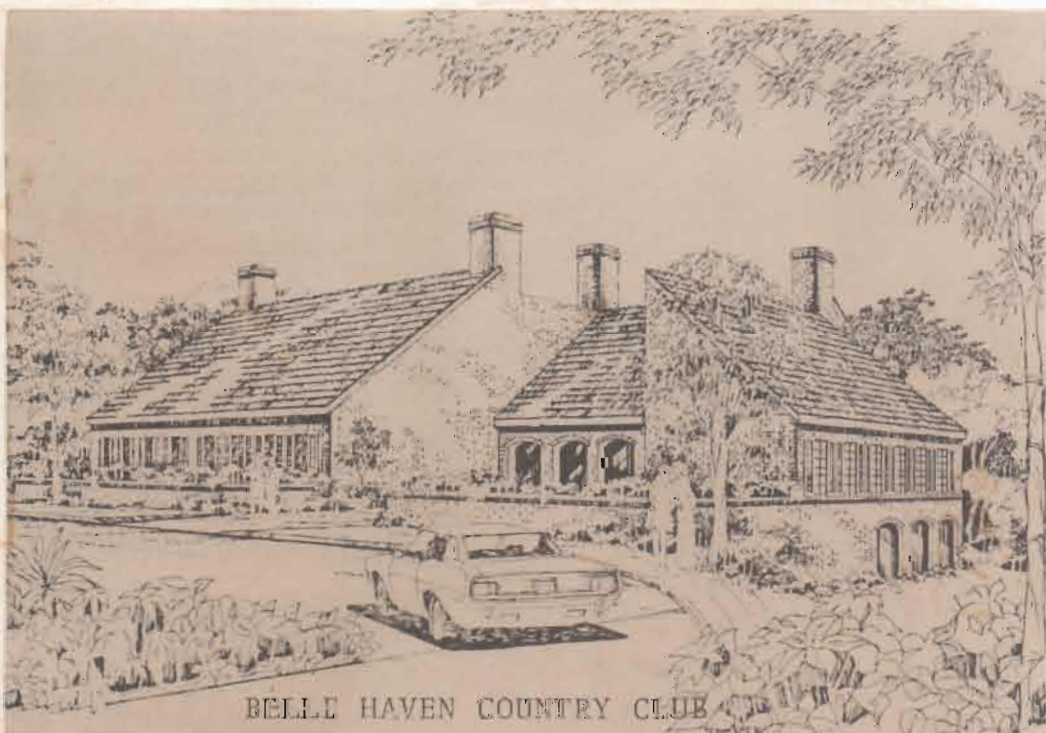

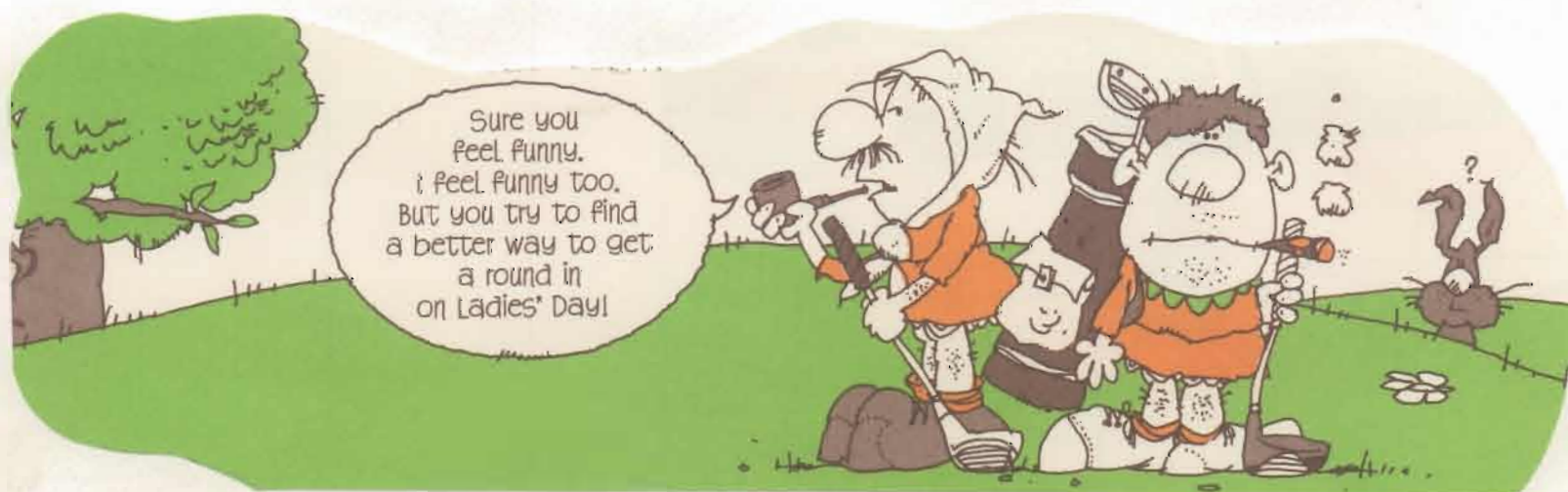

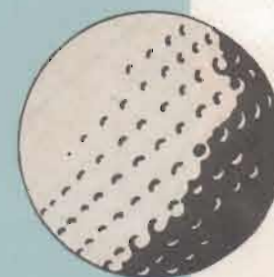

COLUMBIA CC—Congressional Country Club won the Women's District Golf Association's first-division team championship yesterday for the first time in 24 years, ending Army Navy's string of 11 straight titles.

In the final round, Argyle edged Congressional, 3-4, leaving the latter with 28 1/2 points after the seven round-robin matches.

Team Results:
Congressional, 28 1/2; Army Navy and Washingtonian, 34; Columbia, 37; Argyle, 29 1/2; Bethesda, 13; Montgomery Village, 12. Army Navy defeated Washingtonian on the first hole of a playoff for second place.

First Round Results Mean Little in WDGA

Congressional and Columbia scored nine-point sweeps and Argyle and Washingtonian tied 4 1/2-4 1/2 in opening-round play in the Women's District Golf Association's first team matches yesterday. The results were inconclusive because Army-Navy's perennial champions were hosts and did not compete.

Congressional may have a shot at Army-Navy with a balanced team that does not have an outstanding player, but a group of low handicappers who play well together. Congressional blanked Bethesda.

Columbia's shutout over Montgomery Village was not a surprise as the total handicap of the losers is 85 and they admit they probably should not be in the first team play. In comparison, the total handicap of Army-Navy is 48. Play is from scratch, but handicaps give an idea of the relative strengths of the teams.

The next matches will be played tomorrow morning at Bethesda Country Club. The best golf played yesterday was by Carol Davies of Washingtonian, who needed par-in for a 76 when she and Marlene Oravec won their three from Peggy Stortstrom and Carol Mensel of Argyle.

A check by the rules committee revealed no infraction. Kauffman's confusion stemmed from the fact that she had started on the back nine.

The cutoff score was net 79 with 37 women qualifying for the final round today. Defending champion Jody Evans, of the Host Club, had a 78.

Kennedy was out in 44 and back in 39. She had only one double bogey, on the short ninth hole when she put her drive behind a tree, reached the green in two strokes but three-putted. She made a birdie on the short 10th when she put a seven-iron three feet from the pin.

No golfer was able to break 80 gross. The closest was Chris Epperly of Army Navy who came in with an 81. Epperly has a five handicap.

Betty Looney, who won the cup two years ago, came in with a net 72 to remain in striking distance.

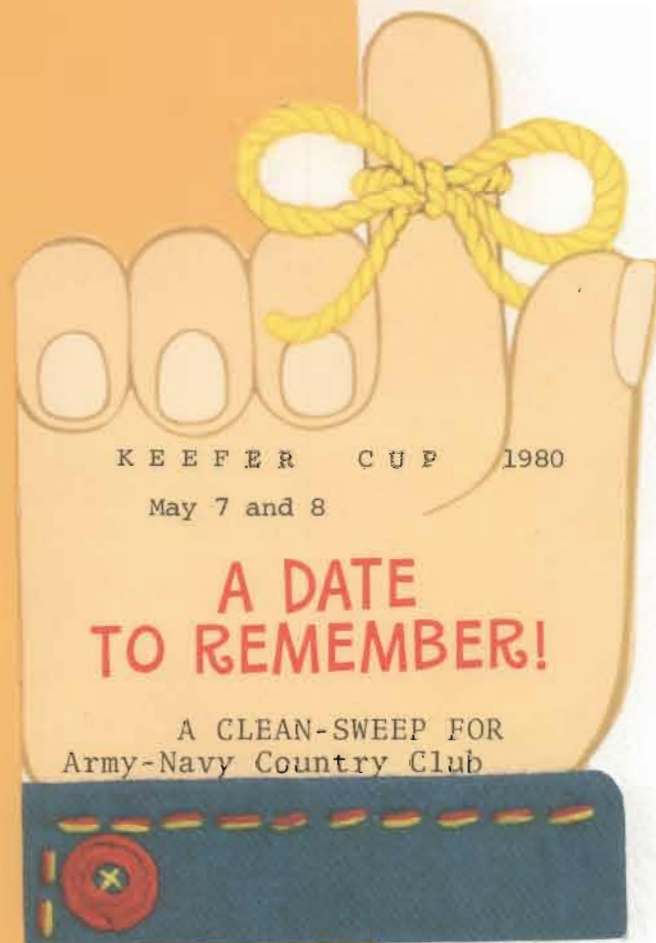

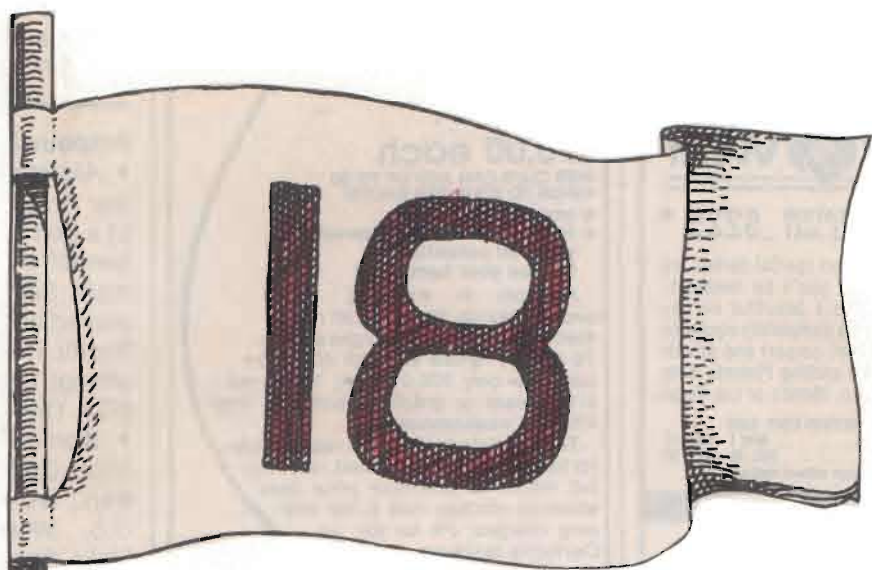

a lot of people haven't played it."

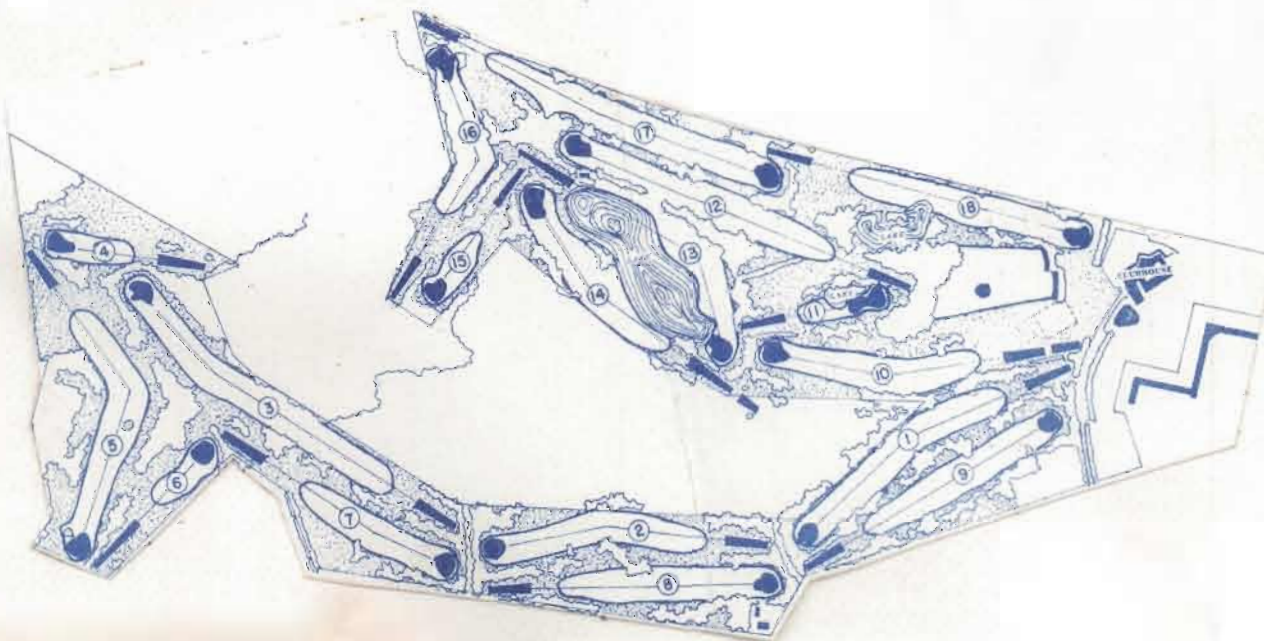

In the tiny world of girls golf in the Washington area, where 14 entries in the Women's District Golf Association junior championship might be unprecedented, where parents are not allowed on the course for fear of distracting the youngsters, it really is possible to score three double bogeys in the span of 36 holes and win the title.

Not without a playoff, it should be noted. Yesterday at Congressional Country Club, Cristy Dristy won the WDGA girls championship by scoring a pair of par 4s on extra

holes, and if that name seems difficult to pronounce it might be worth remembering.

A trim, dark-haired, 16-year-old native of Hawaii who has lived here the last five years, Dristy didn't pick up a golf club with serious intentions until about three years ago, and this is only her second summer of competition.

Two weeks ago, on her home course at Springfield G&CC, she was runner-up to Michelle Hiskey for the girls title in the huge Bobby Bowers Junior tournament, and yesterday she beat Hiskey in the WDGA playoff.

Playing the gold course at Congressional — not the longer blue course, but still demanding for the girls — Dristy held a stroke lead on Hiskey entering yesterday's second round, following an

opening 80. Dristy stumbled to her second and third triple bogeys of the tournament and added an 82 to fall into a tie with Hiskey and her pair of 81s, both totaling 162.

Each parred the first extra hole, but on the second Hiskey — representing the University of Maryland course — missed the green to the right, pitched up and missed a 12-foot par putt, losing to Dristy's regulation 4.

Journal's Golf Writer Top Story in Girls Play

It seemed simple enough. The *Journal* Newspapers in Virginia hired a part-timer golf writer from the Prince George's *Journal* after she moved to Northern Virginia this summer.

Michelle Hiskey's first assignment was to cover the Bobby Bowers tournament at Springfield Country Club last week.

"Piece of cake," her editor told her, "since you'll be out there playing in the girls division anyway."

Well, it turned out that the "piece of cake" for Hiskey was the girls division of the tournament, which she won two up over Christy Dristy of the host Springfield Country Club on Friday afternoon after defeating Diedre Anderson of Baltimore's Worthington Valley Country Club 4 and 3 in the semifinals that morning.

Hiskey, the 17-year-old daughter of former tour pro Jim Hiskey, wielded a hot putter all day Friday, holing a pair of 30 footers and a couple of crucial 8-foot putts.

"My putting won it for me," she agreed. "Those 30 footers just psych people out. On the one I was just trying to hit it near the hole and it went in."

Last year in the Bowers tourney, Hiskey fell 5 and 4 in the first round of match play to Kathy Ayres of Waynesboro, Va.

"The field was a lot stronger last year, and I was playing against a lot of 17-year-old girls. I've got a lot more experience now, but this is the first time I've ever done this well."

Although she has moved to Virginia, where she will play out of Washington Golf & Country Club, Hiskey will finish out her senior year of high school at Eleanor Roosevelt in Prince George's County, where she has lettered on the boys golf team for three years and was the team captain this spring.

Friday's victory in the Bowers qualified Hiskey to compete in the Junior World Series of Golf, scheduled later this year in Daytona Beach, Fla., and also for the local Tournament of Champions for juniors set at Kenwood Country Club later this summer.

"The Tournament of Champions is a pretty elite tourney for club champions and (junior) tournament champions," said Hiskey.

And, of course, the inevitable question comes up. Does she entertain any thoughts about the ladies pro tour? She doubts it. Hiskey right now sees golf as a means for financing her college education in journalism and not much else.

"It's just too hard," she admits. "We have a lot of close family friends on the tour, and I know how they live. I want something with more stability. I don't think I've got enough dedication."

Well, the *Journal* knows it's picked a winner to cover golf. But it may end up having to send a writer with Michelle Hiskey to the tournaments she competes in!

School is out and it is time now for most young people to find a summer job or just relax and take it easy after the classroom pressures. But for Debbie Zahand, 15, from Vienna, it is time to get down to the serious business of making a dream come true.

Her dream: competing on the Ladies Professional Golf Association (LPGA) Tour. To make it will take a lot of hard work and concentration. She has the capacity for hard work and is developing her powers of concentration. She is well on her way.

Debbie, an above average student and a rising junior at Marshall High School, has just finished her second season playing on the Statesmen's otherwise all male varsity golf team. She not only lettered in the sport but, teeing off in the third position, was the team's second lowest scorer.

This isn't easy for a woman playing in a man's league. Since she was playing on a men's team, she had to hit the longer distances from the men's tees. But she overcame this handicap with her accuracy, consistency and her 190-200 yard tee shots.

"This accuracy and consistency" said Marshall coach Jim Earl, "has definitely been a big help in putting

together a string of good wins for us this season." Added Earl, "By the time she is 16, she'll be up there with the best golfers, male and female, in the state."

This is an opinion shared by that master of teaching pros, Bob Toski. He studied Debbie's game in Florida when she was just 14. Watching her "sweet swing", he said, "by the time she is 16 she can't miss." Debbie hopes he's right.

But hoping won't make it so. She realizes that golf is a game that requires much practice and wide exposure to the pressures of formal competition. The summer vacation months will give her the time she needs for hours on the driving range and practice greens, most of it at Westwood Country Club in Vienna where she first swung a club at age eight. She's been playing ever since.

Debbie has her game down to a nine handicap. At the moment, however, she is playing better than a nine, more than adequate for high school golf and enough to challenge most of the best women golfers in the area.

Her practice and tournament schedule will keep her busy all summer and well into the fall. This year she will vie for the Virginia Junior State Championship in the 14-15 age group. Last year she won this title in the 11-13 age group.

She has registered for most of the local tournaments which do not conflict with her "away" matches. She will play in the Babe Zaharias Memorial in Tampa, Fla., the Junior Girls USGA Championships in Wichita, Kan., and the Girls Division of the local Bobby Bowers Tournament at Springfield Golf and Country Club.

To do all this the 5-foot-4, 113-pound athlete will compete in less organized soccer this season, a sport in which she excels. And when both the golf and soccer seasons are over, she can return to her books and her second love, varsity basketball, a sport in which she lettered the last two seasons at Marshall.

Davies Wins WDGA Medal

Carol Davies, a 25-year-old computer systems analyst who has been flirting with the area's top ranking for the past two years, won the medal in the Women's District Golf Association championship on a rain-soaked Argyle course yesterday with a two-over-par 75.

Five strokes back was Chris Liebedz of Army Navy, a 21-year-old senior at the University of Florida. It was her first time in a district championship.

feet, and the 18th, when she was on the short par-5 in two strokes and two-putted.

Liebedz played steady golf with 11 pars and seven bogeys.

The trunk of a maple tree and a three-foot birdie putt by Carol Davies kept Jane Abood from completing what would have been a major upset in her debut in the 53rd Women's District Golf Association championship yesterday at Argyle CC.

"I tried several stances in order to hit the ball with some force," Abood said, "but the only thing I could do was chip out into the open. I thought about hitting the ball with the back side of the club but I have never practiced that before so I decided not to try it."

Davies got down in two from the green, recorded her second birdie of the day and earned the right to take on Sharon Briggs in today's second round. Briggs defeated Tina Marlowe, 3 and 2, to advance into the second day of match play.

Briggs Brushes Off Pressure in WDGA

"I think I need some Pepto Bismol," were the first words that emanated from Sharon Briggs yesterday after she sank a one-foot putt for a par on the 17th hole to defeat Carol Davies, 2 and 1, and move into the quarterfinals of the Women's District Golf Association championships at Argyle.

But in reality it was Davies whose stomach was turning because her hopes of capturing her first WDGA crown had been dashed.

For 13 holes, the two traded off 1-up leads, but on the par-4 14th hole, Davies three-putted from 30 feet and was never able to even the match thereafter.

On the decisive 120-yard 17th hole, Briggs knocked her tee shot onto the green while Davies pulled her first shot off to the left past the green. Her chip then ran past the pin, giving her a 15-foot return putt which she left short of the hole by a matter of inches. Briggs then knocked in her par putt for the match.

"I am just a weekend golfer and I take my vacation to play in this tournament," Briggs said in the clubhouse, swigging a martini instead of a stomach-calmer. "I am not used to all this pressure. It takes me a long time to really get settled down."

The resident of Montgomery Village reflected that uneasiness when she four-putted on the ninth green to go down at the turn. But she won the par-4 10th hole with a par to regain her composure and sank a 25-foot birdie putt on the par-5 12th to gain the momentum.

"After that four-putt disaster, I just told myself to forget everything and start anew," Briggs said. "When I sank that putt on 12, I started to feel confident."

Briggs was to face Ruth Meaders of Army Navy, who shot even par for 14 holes and defeated Cathy Eyre, 5 and 4, in today's quarters. Meaders sank a 25-foot birdie putt on the eighth hole and went on to win the next three holes to take full command of the match.

"Cathy missed a 10-foot putt on eight and when I sank the 25-footer, I think that kind of shook her up," Meaders said.

In another match, 18-year-old Karen Jones, two down after two holes, recovered to defeat the University of Florida senior Chris Lebedez, 5 and 4. The match was tied after nine, but Jones won every hole on the back nine except one to advance. She will meet Chris Epperly, who disposed of Carmen Oelsner, 3 and 2.

Karen Jones Has Some Fun On Way to Championship

Karen Jones entered the Women's District Golf Association championship at Argyle Country Club because "I was just out to have some fun." As it turned out, Jones' idea of a good time was enough to take home the winner's trophy in yesterday's final round.

Jones, playing on her home course, needed 18 holes to defeat Sharon Briggs of Montgomery Village, 1 up. "I just played steady golf and told myself not to get too far behind," Jones said. "I figured par would be enough to win."

On all but two of the 18 holes, one or the other scored a par or a birdie. The lead changed hands three times before Jones was able to gain a par 5 on the 430-yard 18th hole for the victory.

Jones, 18, WDGA Titlist With 1-Up Win Over Briggs

Karen Jones of Argyle birdied the par-5 18th hole at her home course yesterday to turn back Sharon Briggs of Montgomery Village, 1 up, in the Women's District Golf Association championship.

Jones, who turned 18 in April to become eligible for the women's tournament, became one of the youngest winners in the 56-year history of the event. For Briggs, a weekend golfer who works as an administrative assistant, it was another disappointment. She also was the runner-up in the 1977 tournament, to Sue Keeney.

A fine match, it was made more difficult by the wind, which was gusting at 29 miles per hour and appeared ready at times to blow the 115-pound Jones off the course. But the fragile-looking player consistently outhit her opponent with drives of more than 215 yards.

Jones took a quick lead by winning the first two holes but Briggs won the next two to even the match. From that point on, neither player had more than a one-hole advantage and the match was squared five times before Jones won on the 18th.

Briggs was 1 up after the first nine but Jones won the 10th when her opponent put her drive out of bounds. Jones missed a six-foot putt for a par on the 11th and went down a hole again. But the home-club player evened the match on the 12th when Briggs missed a short putt and took bogey.

Briggs putted poorly on the 13th and Jones again went 1 up. Briggs got

that hole back when she birdied the 14th hole from 18 feet.

Jones went 1 up at the 15th when Briggs put her drive into a creek. The 16th was halved and Briggs evened the match for the last time on the short 17th with a par.

At the 18th, Jones put her 220-yard drive squarely in the middle of the fairway and was on the fringe of the green in two. Briggs was back of a tree with her drive and had to chip out. She also hit to the fringe but was lying three. Jones then chipped to within a foot of the pin for the title.

Karen Jones, who is headed for Oklahoma State on a golf scholarship this fall, will take along an important title in her file of credentials, although she entered the Women's District of Columbia GA championship just "to have some fun."

Jones, who was eligible for the tournament for the first time at age 18, barely qualified for match play with 13-over-par 86, but then won twice in a total of 29 holes on her home course at Argyle CC, before encountering difficulty.

Jones had to go 20 holes to win her semifinal from Chris Epperly of Army Navy CC, the losing finalist in 1979, and in the 18-hole final, Karen won by one up by taking the home hole with par five to beat Sharon Briggs of Montgomery Village.

Mason Wins Medal in Md. Women's Amateur Golf

Jane Mason, a veteran campaigner who won the first of her two titles in this event in 1965, won the medal in the 60th annual Maryland State Women's Amateur championship at Kenwood yesterday with a three-over-par 74.

Pamela Smyth of Congressional won the one-day senior championship, her third, played in conjunction with this tournament. Her 82 beat Bethesda's Laura Miller by four strokes.

Mason, a small woman from Nassawango Country Club on the Eastern Shore, was playing the Kenwood course for the first time.

"I thought of passing this one up with all the good young golfers entered," she said. "But I thought I'd give it a try."

Mason's last Maryland State title was in 1974. She has been the medalist in this tournament five times.

Mason played with Sally Voss, the sunny-natured Congressional entrant, who won this title in 1978 but since has been too busy with her studies to

compete in the East. However, Voss did win the California State Amateur and played in the U.S. Women's Open at Nashville last week.

Voss was a stroke behind Mason, along with Lisa Abood of the host club and Cindy Davis of Belair, the 1979 Maryland Junior Champion.

Patricia Thompson, the defending champion who was exempt from qualifying, drew Sharon Briggs of Montgomery Village as her first-round opponent Tuesday. Briggs recently lost in the final of the women's District championship.

Mason was out in 37 and home with the same score. She bogeyed the second, third and fifth holes when she had trap trouble, but birdied the par-5 seventh with a 10-foot putt. She birdied the short 13th when she put a three-wood shot seven feet from the hole and made the putt.

Newcomer Joins WDGA Title Hunt

Maybe the first thing you ought to know about Ruth Meaders is that she lowered her handicap by 13 strokes over a period of 14 months. In golf, that can be likened to a baseball hitter improving his batting average, say, 100 points over a similar stretch. It happens, but seldom.

We are not discussing a youngster just taking up the game. Meaders lowered her handicap from 19 to six after she had been playing golf about eight years.

Meaders is a native of Nova Scotia who moved at age 21 to Toronto for a year and a half, then to Bermuda for nine years. It was in Bermuda that she met her husband, Dr. Robert Meaders, a Navy flight surgeon now retired. Then they really began to travel, as do many service couples.

The Meaders moved to San Diego, Pensacola, Guam, Jacksonville, Yuma, Ariz.; Memphis — usually for two or three years at each stop — then to Bethesda last fall.

Judging from her performance in the Keefer Cup 10 days ago, when she was the lone contestant to break 80 in two days at Chevy Chase Club, she is a strong candidate for the Women's District Golf Association title next month.

The dramatic improvement in her game occurred in late 1968 while the Meaders were in Pensacola.

"I took some lessons," she says. "The swing was always there, but the thinking wasn't there. The man who helped me, Jerry Harper — just a good old boy from Arkansas — taught me to think better and be more methodical. I had a tendency to be too quick, to step up and hit a shot before I thought about it."

"He taught me to visualize the shot in a positive fashion. I think it changed my whole life, to be more patient with myself and other people. I think I had a tendency to be more short-fused. I was really a hyper person. I still am, unless I watch it."

Her titles include the Pensacola City women's championship twice, the Guam Island for four years, the Jacksonville women's area twice, the world-wide Military Dependents in 1977, the Arizona Southern Division and the Memphis area women's last year.

Clearly, she knows how to win. Another thought about the WDGA championship five weeks hence at Argyle: Sally Voss, titlist the last two years, probably won't be home from medical school in time to defend. Her last exam is June 25 at the University of California at San Francisco, where she is completing her first year.

Schiefelbein Adds Another Title

Winifred Faunce, HEW Employee

Winifred Faunce, 75, a retired employee of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare who was a noted area amateur athlete, died of cancer Monday at the Wisconsin Avenue Nursing Home.

Miss Faunce won the South Atlantic and the District diving championships in the early 1920s. She turned her attention to golf in 1926, and two years later won the Evening Star Tournament Trophy. In both 1934 and 1935 she won the District Women's Golf championship.

Miss Faunce was a resident of Washington. She was a member of both the Manor and Brooke country clubs.

She leaves no immediate survivors.

Metta M. Streit Dies; Was Prominent Golfer

Metta Megeath Streit, 76, who was active in women's golf activities and volunteer work here, died Thursday at Walter Reed Medical Center of a liver ailment. She lived on Falstone Avenue in Chevy Chase.

Mrs. Streit was women's golf champion of the Chevy Chase Country Club in 1957, 1958, 1959, and 1960.

A native of Franklin, Pa., she received her bachelor of arts degree from the University of Wisconsin, where she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa, and a master's from Columbia University Teachers College. She married John P. Streit, now a retired Marine Corps major general, in 1926.

Mrs. Streit was chairman of the Armed Services Committee United Thank Offering from 1956-1958; president of the Women's District of Columbia Golf Association from 1959-60; volunteer assistant to the editor of the Washington Diocese newspaper from 1976-1980; and parliamentarian of Women's District of Columbia Golf Association from 1976-1970.

She was also a member of the American Dietetic Association, the Alpha Phi Sorority, the Vassar Club of Washington, the Dobbs Alumnae Association, the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Mount Vernon Miniature Schnauzer Club.

She was awarded Walter Reed Army Medical Center's silver medal in February 1977 for "selfless devotion to the ideals of the Army Medical Department."

Her husband died in 1976. She leaves a son, John P. of Walton Beach, Fla.; a daughter, Metta S. Halla of Paris, France; and five grandchildren.
