With Touch of St. Andrews, Fleming Leads Keefer Cup

Susan Fleming of Arlington, who played collegiate golf at St. Andrews in Scotland, shot 84-11—73 to take the first-round lead of the 36-hole Women's District Golf Association Keefer Cup yesterday at Chevy Chase Club.

Carmen Oelsner of Bretton Woods, who birdied the par-3 No. 10 hole and finished 84-10—74, shared second with Rita Chadwick of Lakewood (83-9—74) and Wendy Stewart of Belle Haven (87-13—74).

Next were Peggy Widicus of Army Navy (87-12—75) and reigning WDGA champion Brenda Baker of Hidden Creek (77-2—75).

Yesterday's winds had little effect on the straight-driving Fleming of Bretton Woods. She birdied the third hole, with a 12-foot putt.

"The wind just doesn't bother me," said Fleming, 31, who came here

four years ago from Scotland with husband Alex, who works as an economist for the World Bank. "I used to play on a links-type course [Monifieth, near Carnoustie in Scotland]."

Fleming golfed for the University of St. Andrews, where she earned a degree in economics. She later became an elementary school teacher. Historic St. Andrews was her college's home course and Fleming regularly shot in the 80s there. Her best finish on the WDGA circuit was last year, when she won first flight of the association's championship.

Kim Williams of Bethesda, who will represent the United States in the Curtis Cup matches in August, had gross 78 and was one stroke behind Baker in that division. Williams, winner of four national women's tournaments last year and low amateur in this season's LPGA Dinah Shore tournament, had the lowest handicap in yesterday's field, a plus 2, which means her average round is under par.

Fleming's Steady Play Earns Keefer Cup Title

Susan Fleming birdied the third hole for the second straight day and finished with 80-11—69 for a 36-hole net of 142 to win the Women's District Golf Association Keefer Cup by six shots yesterday at Chevy Chase Club.

Betty Looney, a 13-handicap golfer from Army Navy, finished second with 72—148, followed by Peggy Widicus of Army Navy (12 handicap), 76—151.

Before she teed off yesterday, Fleming witnessed an unfortunate soul seven-putting the sloping 10th green. WDGA President Julie Hemsing further demonstrated the danger by five-putting No. 10.

"I knew I had to be careful there," said Fleming, who moved to Arlington from Scotland four years ago and plays out of Bretton Woods. Fleming did three-putt the 10th hole for a bogey, but earlier had birdied the par-5 third hole after hitting a pitching wedge approach three inches from the cup. Her round was steady throughout.

Fleming, 31, started playing golf at age 9 and, after she played for

the University of St. Andrews in 1972-76 (with historic St. Andrews as her team's home course), she lowered her handicap to eight strokes.

Fleming, whose previous best showing was winning the WDGA first flight title last year, said of her Keefer victory: "It's great. I really enjoy playing in the District."

Kim Williams of Bethesda Country Club, named to this year's Curtis Cup team, shot 80 and tied for low gross at 158 with present WDGA champion Brenda Baker of Hidden Creek (81).

Susan Fleming, a native of Monifieth, Scotland, who is playing her fourth season in the Women's District Golf Association, won her first WDGA cup yesterday in an impressive fashion seldom seen. Not only was her victory achieved in the 54-year-old Keefer Cup at Chevy Chase Club, but she scored 142 net for the 36 holes and won by six resounding shots. Even with stroke allowances, 2-under-par 142 is a rare low score in this old event. Fleming, of Bretton Woods Recreation Center, led by a stroke after an opening 84-11-73 Wednesday, then shot 80 for net 69 yesterday to run away from the pack.





Oelsner of Bretton Woods, 4 and 3, while Marren edged Sheila Dagucon of Montgomery, 3 and 2. Oelsner shot 77 Monday, with Dagucon finishing at 79.

There is, however, some hope for at least three county golfers.





Williams Eliminated

Penny O'Linger of Ocean City upset medalist Kim Williams on the 20th hole of their first-round match in the Maryland Women's Amateur yesterday at Chevy Chase Club.

O'Linger surprises Williams in women's amateur

CHEVY CHASE — Penny O'Linger, the last qualifier in the championship flight, shocked medalist Kim Williams with a winning 30-foot putt on the second extra hole to highlight first-round play in the women's amateur championship of the Maryland State Golf Association yesterday.
Although Williams led a 57-play-

er field with a 1-under-par 70 on the 5,735-yard Chevy Chase Club course Tuesday, and O'Linger was one of two to get in with 81s, such are the vagaries of match play that no more than one hole separated the two after the fifth green.

O'Linger, from Ocean City Yacht & Country Club, birdied the 16th hole with a three-foot putt to get even at that point, and they halved the next three holes with bogeys, each missing a short putt that would have ended it, before the climactic 369-yard second hole.

Williams, from Bethesda C.C., drove into trees on the right, put her second shot in a bunker, came out strongly and putted to within three feet. O'Linger, who does not have Williams' strength or length, was

short of the green in two, chipped weakly to 30 feet, and calmly holed

the putt.

The winner had fallen two-down after three holes, but squared it with birdies at the fifth and sixth (a 60yard chip-in), and it was back and forth the rest of the way. Both players shot 3-over-par 74s, with O'Linger geting four birdies, and Williams, still plagued by putting problems, two. Williams had beaten O'Linger in the semifinals en route to her only state title two years ago.

O'Linger, an Eastern Shore native, has enjoyed most of her success in Shore events. She won the prestigious Pepsi tournament two years ago, and the Peninsula title five

Those at the site weren't the onlyones surprised by the outcome. When O'Linger called her husband Randy, the former head pro at Ocean City and now general manag-er of Philadelphia Golf Inc., which leases that city's public courses, his first response was, "You're kidding."



Lois Ledbetter makes the cut

"I'm going to make the cut this time."

She shot 85, a record. Harriot had won the title in 1906, then was dethroned the following year by Margaret in an all-sisters final after Margaret won medalist honors with a 95. Margaret Curtis also won consecutive champion-

ships in 1911 and 1912.
