IN MEMORIAM
To Our Good Friend - Nancy Hollenbeck

Hollenbeck's Valiant Fight Ends

Nancy Hollenbeck, USN, Lt. Commander, Retired, died June 17 at her home in Annandale.

Hollenbeck won the Virginia Women's State Amateur Championship in 1975, one of her many golf triumphs. The same year she won the Keefer Cup at Chevy Chase Country Club. She also won the International Women's Service Golf Championship in 1972 and was the women's champion at Army-Navy Country Club in 1977 and 1986.

Hollenbeck was a USGA certified referee and officiated in both men's and women's tournaments throughout the state. She served for several years on the VSGA Women's Division Board and the Women's District Golf Association Board.

Maggie Willoughby, a current member of the VSGA Women's Division Board, wrote the following tribute to Hollenbeck, her longtime friend and golfing companion:

"The VSGA Women's Division lost a staunch supporter, a valiant fighter, and excellent golfer and a good friend on June 17th. Nancy G. Hollenbeck, USN, Lt. Commander (Retired) and Women's State Amateur Champion in 1975, lost her life to cancer.

"Aside from her ever-expanding knowledge of Rules of Golf, Nancy was dedicated to being the best she could be as a golfer and as a person. When confronted with the news that she had cancer--a type that was viciously progressive and resistant to most, if not all known treatment, Nancy did not stop growing as a person, nor did she take time out to weep for the limited time given her. Rather she met each day as a challenge and accepted it as a gift.

Just seven days before she succumbed to her disease she asked a physical therapist friend to come work with her to try to restore the muscles atrophied by weeks of hospital confinement. Nancy was still looking forward to a better tomorrow.

"Whether Nancy was playing the game she loved in a competition or playing with friends for pleasure, she played with a verve and honesty that led her through portals of victory only few can cross. It will be many years before we can watch the finals of the State Amateur without thinking of Nancy accompanying the competitors as the referee: fair, impartial and professional.

"I don't think I have--nor do I now many people who do have--the strength of character demonstrated by Nancy these last two years. To fight to win a golf match using your skill and natural ability is one thing, but to meet the "ultimate competitor" with such faith and tenacity and to instill in those around you a sense of hope and promise for tomorrow more bright than the present is the true legacy that Nancy left to those of us who knew her."

WDGA KEEFER CUP

Putting Is a Horror Story As Widicus' 74 Nets Lead

Peggy Widicus of Annandale and Army Navy Country Club shot net 74 and, as other competitors floundered on Chevy Chase Club's tricky greens, she took the first-round lead of the 36-hole Women's District Golf Association Keefer Cup yesterday.

Widicus, 50, birdied the third hole and took 85 strokes in all, subtracting her 11 handicap to arrive at her net score. Paula Brenneman of Columbia Country Club (91-15-76) and Carmen Oelsner of Bretton Woods (89-13-76) were tied for second net, followed by Alice Moore of Prince Georges (91-14-77), Peg Twisdale of Army Navy (89-12-77), Carol Davies of Argyle (82-5-77) and Elizabeth Johnson of the host club (89-12-77).

Widicus, mother of former Worsham and Schoolboy golf champion Fred Widicus, three-putted five greens but there were far worse tales of woe on the slick and sloping putting surfaces.

Nancy Crouch of Army Navy six-putted the 15th green and four-putt greens were common. Brenda Seymour of Hidden Creek, last year's Middle Atlantic Women's champion and one of the top golfers in the field, had a scorecard sprinkled with three-putt greens and used 38 putts in all for 84-2-82.

"Putting was impossible," said Seymour, shaking her head.

"The greens were fast, with the additional complication that the pins were in precarious positions. Is that diplomatic enough?" said Carol Davies of Argyle, whose 82 was the best gross score, followed by Sheila Dagucon of Montgomery, 83, and Seymour and Karen Jones of Argyle, 84.

"I've never won a district tournament," said Widicus, who has played in WDGA events for seven years. "This would be the best to win."

"Of course I will be [nervous]. I'm surprised I'm in the lead, but I've been hitting the ball well. I hope that will continue."

Davies Dominates Keefer

Shoots 76, Wins Gross and Net Divisions

Carol Davies of Garrett Park made four true birdies and won both the net and gross divisions of the Women's District Golf Association Keefer Cup yesterday at Chevy Chase Club.

Davies, who plays out of Argyle Country Club, shot 76 and subtracted her 5 handicap for a net 71 yesterday, finishing with a 36-hole net 148, ahead of Carmen Oelsner of Bretton Woods (76-74-150) and first-round leader Peggy Widicus of Army Navy (74-78-152).

Davies, 33, a soft-spoken computer programmer, underwent surgery for a severe ingrown nail on her right big toe between the first round of this tournament, played almost two weeks ago, and yesterday after a postponement.

"I told my doctor I didn't want it operated on but he said he had to do it because it was so badly infected," said Davies, whose other victory in 12 years of WDGA competition was

the Carpenter Williams Cup. "I had to take a cart today instead of a caddy. It felt pretty good."

"That surgery must have helped her," said Widicus, who went 6 over par on the four par-3s and triple-bogeyed the last hole.

Brenda Seymour, former WDGA champion from Hidden Creek whose 2 handicap was low in the field, was awarded the gross prize with 84-80-164, after Davies secured the more coveted net prize.

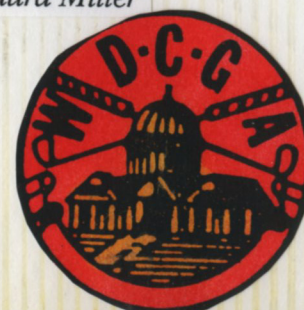
Keefer Postponed

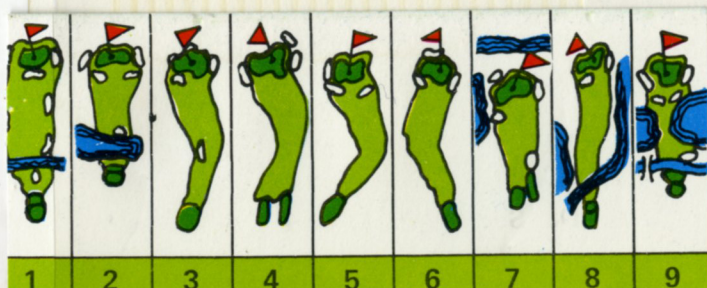

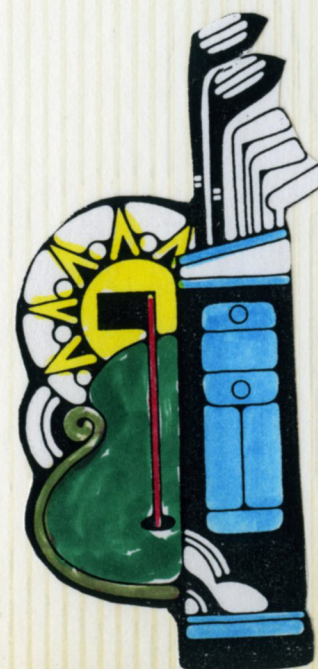

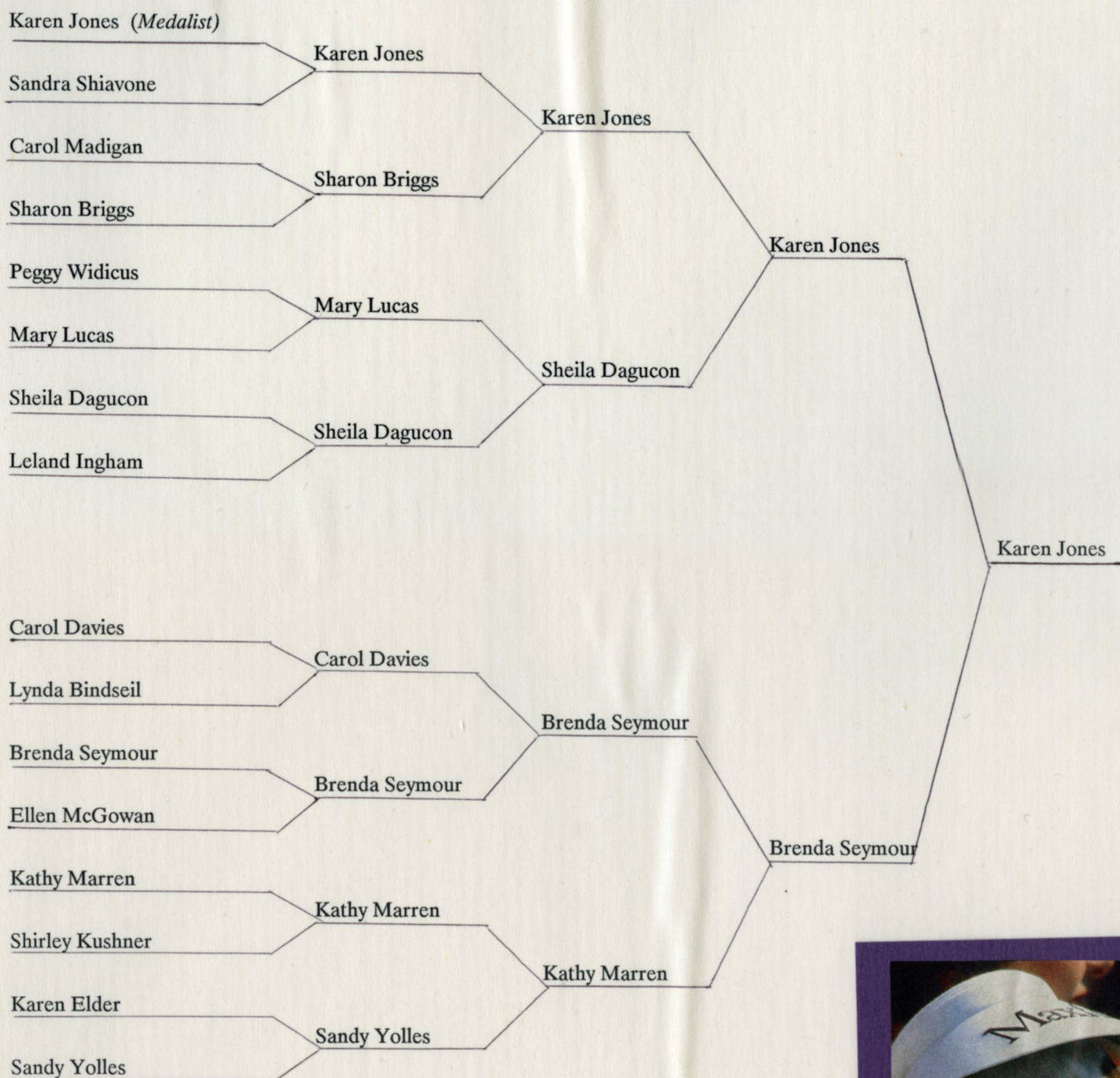

Seymour appeared poised to take a 2-up lead again at the par-3 15th, but she missed a one-foot putt for bogey.

But Marren had some bad fortune when she pushed her drive into trees and double-bogeyed the 16th, again falling 2-down. With a chance to close out the match with a halve on the 17th, Seymour hit into sand with her tee shot and lost the par-3 hole.

Seymour finally won when both golfers parred the final hole.

"Right now I feel very tired, very old," said Seymour. "I've got to conquer [the putting problems]. That really scares me. I've got to put it behind me."

Jones Outlasts Seymour

Karen Jones sank a 35-foot putt on the 18th hole to keep the match alive, then parred the first playoff hole for a 1-up victory over Brenda Seymour and her second Women's District Golf Association championship yesterday at Hidden Creek.

Jones, 26, of Argyle, winner of this title in 1980 and runner-up last year, appeared headed for another second-place finish after former winner Seymour received a fortunate bounce on the 18th hole. With the match even heading to the par-4 18th hole, Seymour's drive appeared headed for disaster toward trees and a creek on the right side, but the ball hit, bounced sharply left and rolled over a bridge into good position for Seymour's second shot.

Jones, meanwhile, hooked her drive behind trees and had to chip back to the fairway.

Seymour hit her second shot onto the green and Jones reached the green with her third shot, still 35 feet from the hole. After Seymour putted her third shot near the hole, Jones rolled in her long par putt to tie the hole, and then made a solid

par on the first playoff hole for victory.

"I thought the end was near," said Jones, of Chevy Chase. "When I made that putt on 18, that was tough for Brenda . . . When someone does that to you, it's truly devastating. I just made a perfect putt. It was so exciting, I'm truly ecstatic."

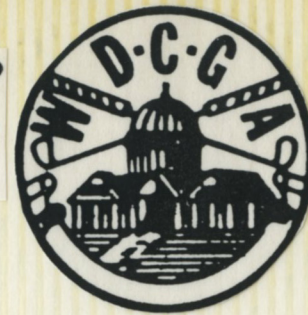
On the playoff hole, Seymour hooked her drive and hit her second shot into the right greenside bunker, blasted out 10 feet beyond the hole and took bogey.

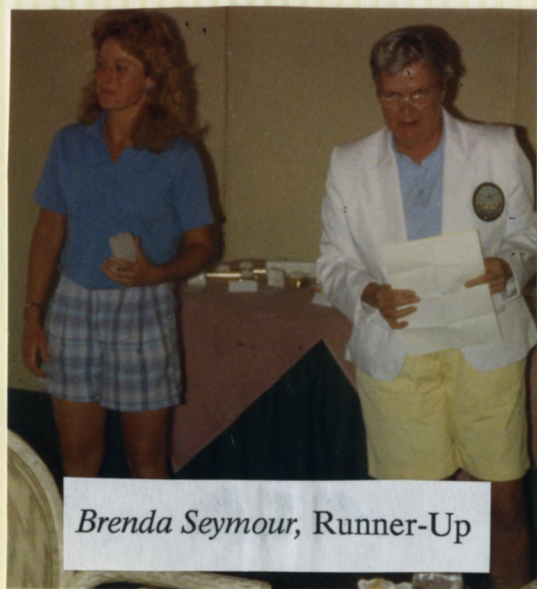

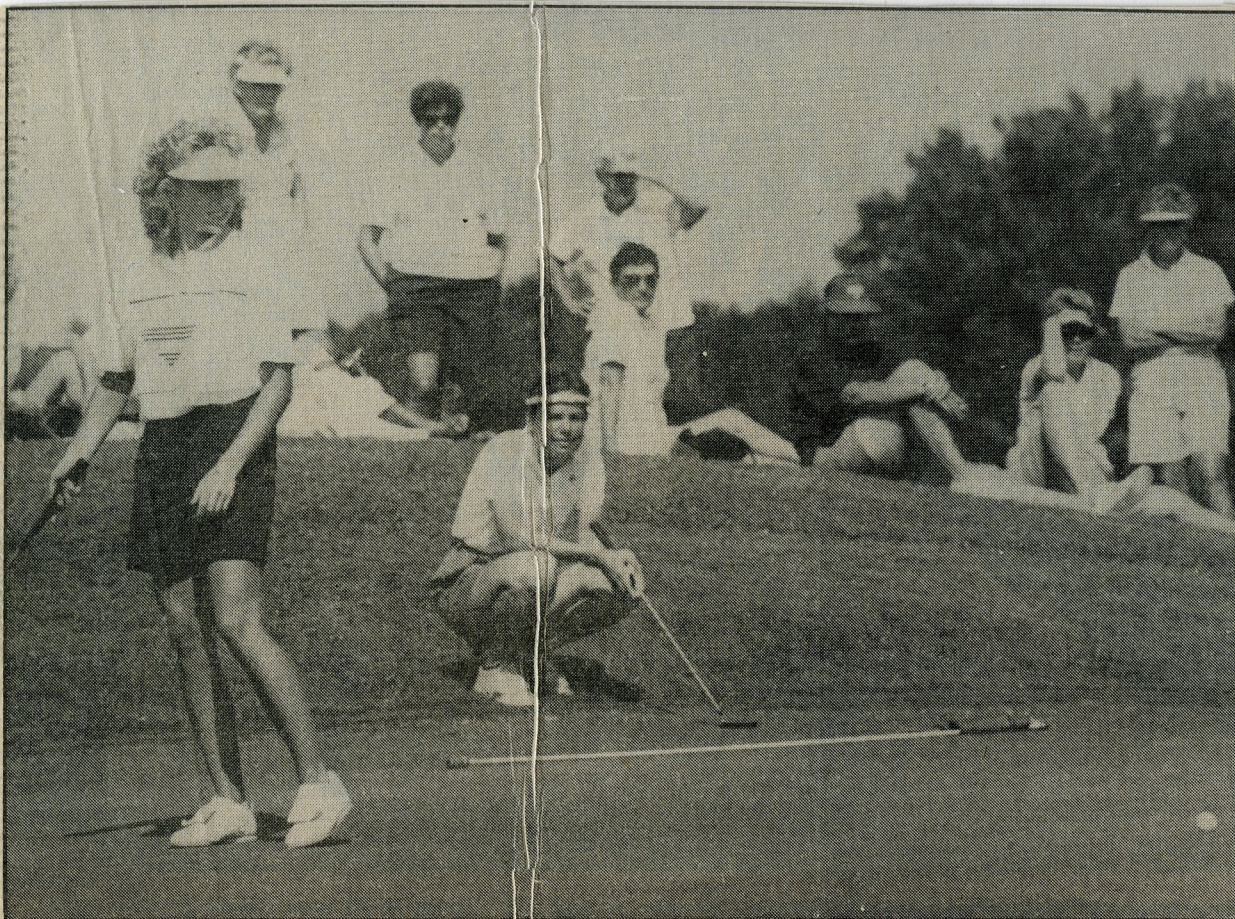

"We're just happy to be here (in final of championship flight)," said Belle Haven's Mimi Hoffman, who took up golf after she graduated from Virginia 10 years ago.

Stewart made sure the four-day trip here had the happiest of possible endings for the six-player Belle Haven team.

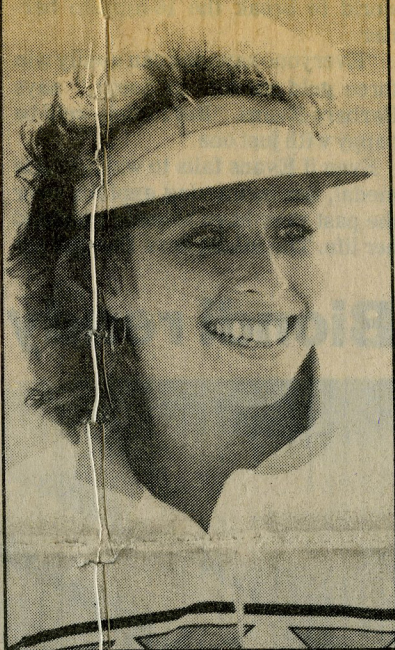
The wife of Belle Haven pro Wheeler Stewart parred the first hole of a sudden death playoff, giving her team an upset win over Cavalier Golf & Yacht Club of Virginia Beach.

Stewart rammed in a 30-foot putt on the 18th hole to force the playoff.

Stewart and her partner, Nancy Duncan, won all three points available in their match with Cavalier's Liz Rogers and Biddy Barnes.

Rogers, a one-time professional who plays to a plus one handicap, sank a long birdie putt on 17 to keep her team in regulation play.

Ruth Ann Verell, 1986 state seniors champion, and Natalie Cunningham, a one-time nationally ranked

tennis player, split their match with Cavalier's Margaret Shotton and Kay House.

Veteran team match player Lu Renner, state seniors champ in 1984, and long-hitting Peggy Yountz blanked Belle Haven's Hoffman and Sue Redfield in the other match.

Forest Park of Martinsville won the first flight, beating Hidden Creek of Reston, 5½-3½. Emilie Woolbridge and Irma Smart swept their match while Fran Hensley and Betty Deal chipped in 2½ points.

The scoring format called for one point for each nine holes and one for the entire 18 holes.

Forest Park's Nan Patterson and Jenny Sherrill, 3-0.

Other flight winners were Country Club of Virginia (Richmond), second; Springfield Golf and Country Club, third; and Westwood Country Club (Vienna), fourth.

CC of Virginia, which defeated host DGC in the semifinals, defeated Roanoke Country Club, 6½-2½. Springfield held the same margin over James River Country Club of Newport News.

Westwood, which featured Corene Turner, who had a hole-in-one in Wednesday's semifinal round, defeated Willow Oaks, 6½-2½. It was the first hole-in-one in competition in the 42-year history of the tournament, a VSGA official said.

In the playoff, with a point going to each two-player match, the score was even going to the Stewart-Duncan and Rogers-Barnes duel, playing last.

Duncan was short on her second shot on the par-four first hole while Barnes was in the trap.

Stewart hit her second shot to about 10 feet beyond the hole and Rogers was also on in regulation, having about a 50-foot uphill putt for birdie.

Rogers left her approach putt short by 10 feet, the same distance Stewart was facing for birdie.

Stewart left her birdie attempt short, but in gimme range. Rogers missed her attempt for par on the low side.

"I was surprised she left the putt that short," the attractive Stewart said of Rogers' birdie try.

Stewart and Duncan, each playing to seven handicaps, were even par for the 19-hole match. They were one over par in their semifinal win over defending champion Army-Navy Country Club.

"Wendy just played super. I was

able to help a little bit, but she played great," Duncan said, happily hugging her playing partner.

The event, which started Monday with practice rounds, is the first state tournament for women ever held here.

The top area women's amateur events are the Women's District Golf Association Championship (June 20-24 at Hidden Creek), the Maryland Women's Amateur (July 12-15 at Chevy Chase), the Virginia Women's Amateur (July 25-29 at Hot Springs) and the Middle Atlantic Women's (Sept. 7-8 at Wintergreen).

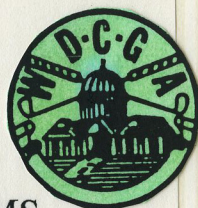

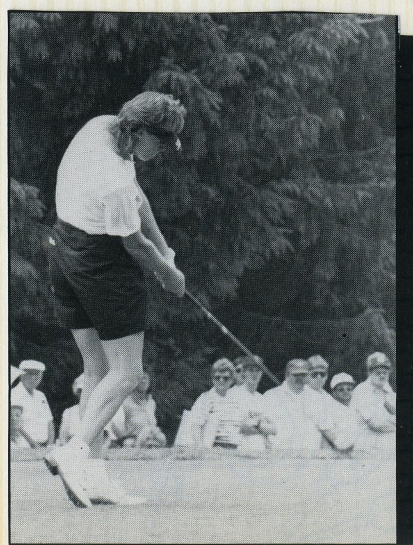
