

# County WDGA golf teams faring well

Although the season is yet young, competition is already sizzling in the Women's District of Columbia Golf Association. After two rounds of intense matches, Montgomery County WDGA teams are, for the most part, either leading or hotly challenging current leaders for the top slots in the six WDGA divisions.

In Division I, Montgomery Village, at 13, is just one-half point behind Hidden Creek. Division II is something of a horse-race: Prince George's and Virginia clubs are dominating, but not by that much; the next several weeks will tell. Indian Spring is No. 1 in Division III—at 59, a big five points over closest competitor Springfield.

In Division IV, powerhouse Avenel has racked up more points—68—than any other team in any other division, and Be-

thesda is in second place with 61. Montgomery County teams have snagged the first four slots in Division V, with Kenwood first at 59, Bretton Woods a very close second at 58½, Montgomery Village third at 52, and Bethesda fourth at 51½. But look out for Congressional, which in its only match to date has accumulated an impressive 34 points; this team will come on strong. Columbia leads Division VI with 61 points, followed by Lakewood, in second place with 53½.

## Kinsella Wins Keefer Cup

#### Widicus Falls Into Tie for 2nd

Sheila Kinsella of Arlington and Bretton Woods, playing in her first Keefer Cup since back surgery 12 years ago, shot a final-round 76 and finished with a 36-hole net total of 149 to win yesterday at Chevy

First-round leader and defending champion Peggy Widicus of Annandale and Army Navy three-putted five times on her last nine holes and tied Cami Berher

of Montgomery Village at 150.

Berher shot 78-6-72 yesterday. Widicus, who had a two-shot lead after an opening round 71, shot 89-10-79 yesterday. Kinsella subtracted her 12 handicap from her score of 88.

Widicus, who has led the first round of this tournament three straight years, played with Kinsella and had her two-shot lead reduced when Kinsella completed the front nine in 42 to her 43.

Kinsella may have won the tournament on the next two holes. On the par-3 10th, she hit her tee shot into a deep bunker in front of the green, sand-blasted to eight feet beyond the hole and rammed in the putt for

Kinsella's approach shot on the par-5 11th hole left her on the green but about 70 feet from the flag stick. Kinsella stroked her first putt 10 feet short of the hole but then sank that putt and saved another par.

On the finishing holes, Kinsella, along with the rest

of the field, had problems.

After driving poorly and taking double bogey on the 17th hole, Kinsella hit a good drive on the par-4 final hole, but hit a poor second shot from a muddy lie. She hit her third shot left of the green, chipped to five feet and missed the putt for another double bogey. But she survived with a narrow victory after Widicus three

"The back nine on this course is very tough," said Kinsella, a native of Dublin, Ireland, who quit golf after back surgery 12 years ago. To add to that, she hurt her neck in an auto accident five years ago, still feels pain and is just now getting her golf game in

"I didn't panic," Kinsella said. "Those are brutal holes coming in. It's easy to make triple bogey or worse. It's a great test of golf and the course is in wonderful condition."

Widicus bemoaned her putting. "Those five threeputts on the back nine killed me," said Widicus. "It was just the putting. There was nothing wrong with the long game."

Sharon Briggs of Montgomery Village, who challenged for the lead after an opening-nine 38 yesterday, shot 81 and tied for low gross at 160 with Sheila Dagucon of Montgomery (79-81-160). Briggs and Dagucon also tied for fourth in net with 152. Shawn McCullough, WDGA champion from Woodlawn whose one handicap was best in the field, was third low gross with 81-162.

### Widicus Up By Two in Keefer Cup

Defending champion Peggy Widicus of Annandale and Army Navy Country Club overcame a shaky start and shot net 71 to take the first-round lead of the 36-hole Women's District Golf Association Keefer Cup yesterday at Chevy Chase Club.

Rita Chadwick of Lakewood (83-10-73), who was tied after the first round of this event four years ago, and Sheila Kinsella of Bretton Woods (85-12-73), playing her first Keefer in more than a decade, are tied for second.

Sharon Briggs of Montgomery Village (79-4-75), Sheila Dagucon of Montgomery (79-4-75) and Lori Wood-Griffin of Westwood (80-5-75) were next at net 75.

After driving on the par-4 opening hole, Widicus could not see the green for her second shot. She hit a 5-wood shot over the horizon and the ball ended up in greenside sand on the left, and she ended up sinking a 10-foot putt for double bogey six.

But Widicus, who has led the first round of this event for three consecutive years, then steadied. She parred nine of the next 11 holes and applied her 10 handicap to a score of 81.

"On the first hole, I thought I knew where I should be going," said Widicus of her "blind" approach shot over a hill. "I hit it very good, but it went into the left bunker, just off line.

"I'm very happy," said Widicus, a member of Army Navy which has several times won the WDGA team title. "There's pressure on the final day. You don't swing quite as loosely, but I got that first one last year."

Fitzgerald then hit a beautiful 3-iron tee shot to within eight feet of the hole at the par-3 13th and made par to regain a 3-up lead and closed out Hanley with her near eagle two holes later.

Hanley did not appear discouraged by the loss. "I missed a few putts on the front nine," she said. "Jane played extremely consistent.





### Ask the Golfers.

QUESTION: Who from a Montgomery County club or course other than your own would be the toughest amateur golfer to beat in matchplay competition?

ANSWERS: From Frank Abbott of Lakewood, former Washington Metropolitan Amateur Champion: "Marty West of Columbia because of his outstanding record of accomplishment. No contemporary player has accomplished what Marty has accomplished in the last 15 years.

From Martin West III of Columbia, seven-time Maryland State Amateur Champion and current Vice-President of the Middle Atlantic Golf Association: "There are a number of players who are highly competitive, so to pick one is a very hard task. There are several at Congressional who are very tough. The one who has played the best in current years is Pat Tallent. "

From Pat Tallent, current Club Champion at both Congressional and the TPC at Avenel and 1989 Medalist in the Maryland State Amateur: "Marty West is a tough competitor in match play and always has been. He's better than most people in Maryland, and he's the one guy in this area who has a national reputation."

From Jane Fitzgerald, current Maryland State Women's Amateur Champion: "I enter a match-play tournament with the philosophy that on any given day anyone has the potential to be your toughest competitor. It's hard to name a single person."

From Mary Lou Svec, Women's Golf Chairman at Columbia and and Past-President of the Montgomery-Prince George's Women's Golf Association: "Probably Melly Tucker of Argyle. I've seen her play at the Corby Cup at Columbia, and she's very consistent in the fair-

ways and very tough around the greens."

From Sharon Briggs, current Club Champion at Montgomery Village: "Probably Sheila Dagucon of Montgomery Country Club or Karen Jones of Argyle.

They're just fantastic players, whether it's stroke or match play."

From Karen Jones of Argyle, 1988 Women's District Golf Association Champion: "I would say Carole Harris, who plays out

of Kenwood as well as Argyle. I would also say Sharon Briggs of Montgomery Village, and Tara Hipp, also of Montgomery Village. They've always been very strong competitors, good players."
