## Fairley, Davies Out Front

Defending champion Paula Fairley of River Bend coped with the wind and cold and shot net 69 at Chevy Chase Club yesterday to take the first-round lead in the 36-hole Women's District Golf Association Keefer Cup.

Fairley made two natural birdies and six pars and shot the back nine in 39. She finished with gross 81, then subtracted her handicap of 12 for a two-stroke lead heading into today's

Past Keefer winner McGowan of Springfield is second at 81-10-71, followed by Betty Davis of Bethesda, 83-11-72.

Carol Davies, a past Keefer winner from Garrett Park, made four birdies in the blustery conditions and leads the gross division at 78.

She is one shot ahead of reigning Women's District champion Sheila Dagucon of Montgomery, former WDGA champion Shawn McCullough of Mount Vernon, and Poinsett.

"It was cold this morning," said Dagucon, of Gaithersburg. my mittens and my hat on.

## Fairley Defends Keefer Title, Defeating McGowan by 6

Paula Fairley of River Bend nearly made a hole-in-one and did finish with a second straight net 69 to successfully defend her Women's District Golf Association Keefer Cup yesterday at Chevy Chase Club.

Fairley, whose gross score each day was 81, finished with a 36-hole net 138 to beat former Keefer winner Ellen McGowan of Springfield by six shots. McGowan, who shot net 73 vesterday, ended one ahead of Barbara Walton of Washington Golf and Country Club (72-145).

McGowan, with a 10 handicap, started the day two shots behind Fairley and was still in contention coming to the par-3, 164-yard 13th hole. There, Fairley hit a 4-wood that stopped within a foot of the hole, and she made birdie 2. McGowan dumped her tee shot into a ditch in front of the green, took double-bogey 5, and Fairlev cruised from there.

"I'm exhausted again," said Fairley, who moved to Great Falls from Connecticut two years ago. "Last year was windy, this was a hurricane. . . [Chevy Chase] is very similar to all the clubs I've played at Connecticut."

"She feels comfortable on this course, no doubt about it," said companion McGowan. "She's competitive, strong, and keeps thinking about her shots."

Former Keefer winner Carol Davies of Argyle (79 yesterday) won low gross in a match of cards over reigning WDGA champion Sheila Dagucon of Montgomery (78) after each finished 36 holes at 157. Judy Poinsett of Army Navy was third, 80-159.

#### **Fairley Repeats As Keefer Cup** Champion

Paula Fairley of River Bend sailed along the windswept fairways of the Chevy Chase Club on May 6 and 7 to claim her second Keefer Cup championship in a row The Keefer Cup, a Class A event, is one the Women's District Golf Association's most prestigious tournaments.

Fairley, carrying a 12handicap, shot a consistent 69-69-138 net for 36 holes, bettered last year's performance by two strokes, and became the first repeat Keefer Cup champion since Alma von Steinner won in 1932 and 1933.

"I was never in trouble," Fairley said afterwards. "I was only in one bunker. I threeputted two greens yesterday and only one today'

Fairley's closest competition this year came from Ellen McGowan of Springfield, who claimed second net with 71-73-144. Barbara Walton of Washington Golf and Country Club was one stroke behind McGowan with 73-72-145 for third net.

Former Keefer Cup winner Carol Davies of Argyle, 78-79, was awarded first gross by a match of cards with reigning District champion Sheila Dagucon of Montgomery, 79-78, after both finished with 157 Judy Poinsett of Army Navy took third gross with 79-80-159

Chadwick, who now plays out of Montgomery Village, was six-time club champion at Lakewood between 1982 and 1990. She finished with (83-12) 71 to lead the field of 39 by two strokes in net.

"I certainly enjoyed playing my old course again," Chadwick said later. "And it helped to know the greens."

Shelley Savage of Army Navy, the lowest handicapper in the winners' circle with a +3, led the gross division with 80. Springfield's Ellen McGowan took second gross with 84 by a match of cards over defending champion Linda Bindseil of Montgomery Village, the third gross with 84. # Savage Overwhelms Dagucon For Women's District Title

Shelley Savage of Arlington shot even par in front of a partisan gallery at her home Army Navy Country Club and overwhelmed defending champion Sheila Dagucon of Gaithersburg, 7 and 5, to win the Women's District Golf Association Championship yesterday.

Savage, 38, a lieutenant commander in the Navy Nursing Corps who served on a hospital ship in the Persian Gulf War, mowed down Dagucon with straight drives, good putting and generally error-free golf.

"I was just steady today," said Savage, who won Monday's qualifying medal with 76 and has been been commuting to duty at Bethesda Naval Hospital after each match this week.

"Unfortunately, Sheila didn't play her usual good game. She just didn't have a good day." Dagucon, from Montgomery Country Club, started on a bad note. She reached the par-5 opening hole in two shots but three-putted for a halving par.

Savage, who is 5 feet 3 and 113 pounds, almost chipped in for eagle and won the second hole with birdie. She also won the next three holes and took a 4-up lead. After a 1-over-par 38 on the front nine, Savage was 5-up. At the par-5 11th hole, Savage reached the green with two big shots and then rolled a beautiful, long lag putt to within inches of the hole for an easy birdie and a commanding 6-up lead.

Dagucon then hooked into a lake on the par-5 13th hole and, after a penalty drop, she hit into a ditch.

#### Savage, No Longer at Sea, Wins **WDGA Championship**

When you're in the Navy, duty calls without regard to handicap. And in August 1990, duty called Shelley Savage.

A 3-handicap golfer and a Navy nurse stationed at the Bethesda Naval Hospital, Savage was suddenly assigned to the U.S.S. Comfort for a tour in the Persian Gulf. She spent eight months on the huge hospital ship preparing to aid Desert Storm casualties that never came.

Much to her surprise, she didn't have to spend eight months waiting to play golf again. Savage said she got to play four rounds of golf and hit hundreds of practice balls into the Atlantic Ocean while serving on the ship.

While the Comfort was in port for routine maintenance, Savage played three rounds at the Emirates Golf Club in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. She also got a chance to play the Abu Dabi Country Club, which she says sounds more impressive than it really was. "It was a sand course and we played with beat up old rental clubs," she said.

On the ship she received a shipment of practice balls from her mother. And a doctor stationed on the Comfort got regular shipments of shag balls from members of his club.

"We had about 500 practice balls that we had to get rid of on the way home," Savage said. "Every day I'd hit 50 or so." She hit all of them with the only golf club on board the ship-a men's 1-iron.

When she returned to the States in April 1991, it took a while to get her short game back in shape. But now everything is in order.

In July, Savage proved it by winning the Women's District Golf Association Championship on her home course—Army Navy Country Club in Arlington, Virginia.

Savage dominated the tournament. She was the qualifying medalist with a 76 and none of her matches went past the 16th hole. In the finals, she defeated defending champion Shelia Dagucon of Montgomery Country Club 7-and-5.

"I played very steady," Savage said. "I played pretty well all five days except my first match."

Still, she managed a 4-and-3 win over Elaine Tingle of Army Navy in that match. She followed that with a 5-and-4 win over Judy Poinsett, also of Army Navy, and a 3-and-2 win over Ruth Ann Verell of Belle Haven to get into the finals.

"The layoff was actually kind of good," Savage said of her time aboard the Comfort. "It didn't really hurt my game too much. I did a lot of aerobics on the ship. I gained a lot of strength and that helped."

The bad news for the rest of the WDGA is that Savage will be stationed at Bethesda for at least another year and should be around to defend her title next year. And if that's not enough, Savage, originally from Trenton, Michigan, says she really likes the Washington area and would love to make her home her for quite a while.





Mallory Crossland didn't expect to do well at the Women's District Golf Association Helen Goldstein Cup for junior girls. The day before, she shot 91 at the Middle Atlantic Junior Girls Championship at the Naval Academy in Annapolis.

But low expectations often lead to low scores. Crossland shot her career-best tournament round—a 77—at Indian Springs Country Club that day. And with that, she topped off an outstanding summer. She won the WDGA Cup at Army Navy Country Club, finished second at the Maryland State Junior Girls Championship, and advanced to the semifinals of the women's championship at the Chevy Chase Club.

She made a birdie on the 10th hole and hit every green but the eighth in regulation. "My problem was, on five or six greens I three-putted," she says.


Eventually, Crossland would like to become good enough to play for a college golf team. With three years to work toward that goal, she has to be considered a top prospect.


# Fitzgerald Wins Medal in Maryland Amateur


